Kenn Wagner has been a first violinist with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra since 1994, also serving as an acting assistant concertmaster. Outside of the ASO he has appeared abroad as guest soloist with the Shenzhen Symphony Orchestra in China, and Christ Church Symphony string section, in New Zealand. Nationally he has soloed with the New Orleans Symphony, Arlington symphony and the Wintergreen Music Festival Orchestra. Locally, Kenn has appeared as soloist with the Atlanta Community Symphony Orchestra, the Dekalb Symphony, Clark/Spellman Symphony, Atlanta Philharmonic, and the Atlanta Musicians' Orchestra with repeat engagements, including a world premiere of Lucas Richman's violin & cello concerto at Spivey Hall last season. A passionate chamber musician Kenn has performed with Riverside Chamber Players, Leaptrott Trio, Atlanta Chamber Players, Awadagin Pratt's Next Generation Festival, and National Chamber Players with special guest Kenneth Slowik of the Smithsonian Chamber Players. Most recently Kenn performed with Eric Wong of the Blair String Quartet at the University of Tennessee, and the Mendelssohn Concerto with the Atlanta Musicians' Orchestra.
